

## DID NOT KNOW A GOOD THING

John Keating, who was released on bail from the county jail yesterday afternoon, got drunk again last night, and going to the home of his wife, who has a furnished room at 208 Chestnut street, created a disturbance that led to Morris Makarow, the proprietor, having him arrested. This morning before the Recorder Keating pleaded guilty and then the complainant told of the constant disorder which Keating caused. Keating claimed that when he went to the house last night that he found his wife in another man's room. Keating was arrested two weeks ago for drunken abuse of his wife, but the woman forbore and made no prosecution and he was released. Last week he was again arrested, charged with

non-support and was sent to jail on this charge. Yesterday morning a friend went his bail, but last night when the friend found that Keating had gone back to hard drinking again, he notified the police that he wanted to give him up. If he had not been arrested on the charge of drunkenness for which the Recorder this morning gave him twenty days, he would have been arrested on the bondsman account.
